


Biodiversity is the basis for the environmental health of our Planet and the source of economic, ecological and food security for future generations

People quite often are not aware of the wildlife that lives in olive groves: birds, bees, spiders, lizards, ants, hedgehogs, rabbits, butterflies, nectar feeders, pollinators and beneficial insects and many others you might not expect to meet in an olive grove. Beneficial species are an important component of IPM strategies and include parasitic and predatory wasps, spiders, predatory beetles and bugs, robber flies and lacewings.










